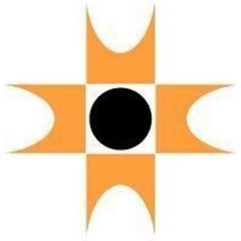

Synopsis of Presentation (provided by the speaker):

The objective of the paper is to present an overview of the use of technology especially in the use of personal computers in the day to day architectural practice. One of the main challenges to an effective practice is the range and extends of problems in practice and to follow the stages of work as required by the LAM stage of work, in line with the scope and condition of engagement. Another is the changing demands of the submitting persons to requirements by the local authorities' submission requirements. This is on top of the competitive nature of the practice itself, and the demand of the clients, especially in the competitive and changing market forces. The paper examines the varied common tools of technology from office automation, CAD, inclusive of the BIM, to workflow software management as applied to varied stages of the scope of work from Schematic Design, Design Development, and Tender Documentation to Contract Administration and Post Completion. To remain competitive and still meet the requirements of the clients, one has to have the tools available to differentiate the firm's expertise or specialization in design and the management of the practice. Any tools available to assist in the delivery of such service will be an added advantage. To remain relevant, the practice has also to have the relevant technology and trained human resource and expertise of the existing and new staff coming into the market and to retain the experiences and knowledge of the firm. The paper attempts to present some ideas of the technologies and management tools available to work smarter and quicker to be competitive and succeed.
